The Washoe County School District sets out to create an education system where all students achieve academic success, develop personal and civic responsibility, and achieve career and college readiness for the 21st century.

Principal's Highlights

Incline High School had several noteworthy accomplishments during the 2009 - 2010 school year:

- In March, Incline High School received the full six-year accreditation from the Northwest Association of Accredited Schools.
- Incline High School had four National Merit Scholars and one U.S. Presidential Scholar for this school year.
- Incline High School again made the list of BEST SCHOOLS IN AMERICA as compiled by Newsweek Magazine.
- Incline High remains one of the top schools in the nation according to the "Challenge Index" of the Washington Post.
- The percentage of students who score a 3 or higher on the Advanced Placement (AP) exams remains the highest in the district.
- The We The People team won the state title for a sixth time and represented Nevada in Washington D.C.
- Over 62% of Incline High's student body participates in SPORTS winning 13 state titles.
- Incline High teacher Milt Hyams is 1 of only 3 teachers in the country to receive the American Civic Ed 'Teaching' Award.
- Incline High's AVID Program will graduate several collegebound students this year.

Goals and Objectives

Goal 1

The number of minorioty students in honors and advanced placement classes (AP) will increase.




