Principal's Highlights

- IHShad the district's highest percentage (75%) of students who scored a 3 or higher on the ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) EXAMS.
- Incline High's AVID PROGRAM, designed to serve students in the middle range, continues to grow successfully.
- The INCLINE STAR FOLLIES and the ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE FOUNDATION continues to provide funds for remediation and technology.
- Incline High School received 69 NEW COMPUTERS from a recent bond to upgrade technology in the school.
- Completed in the spring of 2008, Incline High School is now wired for the INTERNET and WIRELESS computer operations.

Goal 1

Goal 2

All students will improve their math skills as demonstrated on standardized tests.

Objective(s):

- A. The number of students passing the proficiency exam from their sophomore to junior years will increase by 5%.
- B. The number of students passing the district semester math CRT's will increase by 5%.
- C. Continue incorporating more reading and writing into the math curriculum.

Goal 3

Continue the implementation of the AVID program to assist the students in the middle in reaching their potential.

Objective(s):

- A. Move the AVID program schoolwide to have an impact on all students.
- B. Implement Cornell note taking methods in all classrooms.
- C. Refine the recruitment and retention of AVID scholars through better communication with middle school teachers and parents.




